Job Summary

The Director of Annual Giving is a dynamic and multi-tasking fundraising professional who is responsible for securing significant annual revenue for the Boys & Girls Club of Collier County. Director of Annual Giving will be expected to develop fundraising strategies focused on engaging, cultivating, soliciting, and stewarding donors up to approximately \$5,000. The position will implement strategies with particular emphasis on outreach with donors, increasing monthly giving, and growing revenue from annual fund supporters. The Director of Annual Giving will work independently and collaboratively as part of the Development Team.

Key Responsibilities

- Manage a portfolio of individual donors who give up to approximately \$5,000 annually; maintain personal contacts and involvement activities for these donors
- Achieve monthly targets on donor cultivation, solicitation and stewardship activities and keep accurate engagement records
- Work in coordination with the Chief Development Officer and the communications team to design and manage direct marketing efforts focused on messaging to annual fund and mid-level donors, including multiple direct mail/email appeals annually and regular digital communication
- Develop and manage individual donor-specific written materials, including solicitations, renewals, stewardship communications, and program updates
- Coordinate the development and assist in the production of the Annual Report
- Supervise the Donor and Database Manager to ensure all gifts, including in-kind donations, are accurately recorded and entered DonorPerfect, and acknowledgement letters are sent within 72 hours
- In conjunction with Marketing Firm, develop and lead constituent giving efforts through direct mail, email, social media, and other campaigns
- Manage vendor relationships to ensure successful direct mail and email campaigns
- Assist in the planning and oversight of cultivation, stewardship, and recognition events

The successful candidate will have a minimum of 3 years of direct fundraising experience with demonstrated experience engaging directly with donors, and employing moves management processes to encourage increased giving. Candidate will also have the ability to handle sensitive information with discretion



The successful candidate will also have strong attention to detail, excellent organizational skills, demonstrated ability to manage multiple priorities with competing deadlines, and the ability to work independently. Knowledge of and experience with databases, especially DonorPerfect, a strong plus.
