A Club member for three years, Josey appreciates having a safe place to go after school and during school breaks. During the pandemic, when so many aspects of our lives were shut down, the Club was there for Josey. He credits the Club for bringing him out of his shell and providing him with activities that allowed him to make friends. The Club helped him develop social skills and taught him the joy of helping others.

"I have been a part of distributing food through the Brighter Bites program and have learned how awesome it feels to help people out. The Club has taught me kindness and compassion." Josey has been surrounded by supportive mentors who continue to encourage his athletic and professional sports aspirations. "At the Club, I have been able to develop my skills in many sports and learn about leadership and teamwork. I have also seen the value of great coaches and mentors in my life. When I dislocated my shoulder and was taken by ambulance to the hospital, Coach Nigel, the Club's Athletic Director, never left my side. He stayed with me until my mom could get to the hospital. And he stayed with us until I was able to go home. I was scared and in pain, but I was never alone. Coach Nigel made sure of that."

Josey aspires to be a college basketball player and to study sports analytics. Josey feels the Club moves him towards his dreams every day.


2024 CORE AREA UPDATES

HEALTH & LIFE SKILLS




In the Money Matters program, teens are actively engaged in conversations about life after high school, gaining valuable insights into real-world financial management. Each member selected a career and made key decisions such as whether to attend college, where to live, and the type of lifestyle to pursue.

Members simulated weekly and biweekly paychecks and were charged rent, car payments, food, and other expenses. To make the experience more realistic, unexpected costs, such as flat tires, medical bills, and natural disasters, were introduced. This hands-on approach helps members understand budgeting, prepare for financial setbacks, and learn to be fiscally responsible.



CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT



Members introduced themselves, delivered a two-minute speech about their Boys & Girls Club experience, and answered questions from a panel of judges comprised of community and staff members. Three finalists received scholarships and Maria was awarded our 2024 Junior Youth of the Year.

In partnership with Naples Children & Education Foundation (NCEF), selected members from Bolch and Nichols had the opportunity to attend the Annual Cal Ripken Summer Camp in Aberdeen, Maryland.
